"...Style is about expressing the way we feel about things in the right way. Elegance is a large part of simplicity and seeing things for what they are. Elegance cannot be bought, it is innate, one is born with it. We could say that style can be bought when people buy clothes to compliment their figure, but that is a different way of looking at things. It is about associating the clothes with personality. Everyone can be elegant in their own way it just depends on the person's personality. Style is a way of living, a way of holding yourself... Firstly I am an artist touched by many things, modelling dancing... other than design. I am a designer who creates my collections in accordance with my imagination. Women who inspire me are full of life, always on the go, who work and above all who are chic. It is important to give life to a dress, a garment, which associates itself to to the life of a woman, who makes it live in movement. It is great to see a person who becomes attached to a piece of clothing and considers it like a second skin. Style is different for everyone. Everyone sees things in his or her own way, and I propose clothing which will appeal to a variety of clientele, according to taste and trends. All that will be based on my own style. Soft pure lines, easy to wear but still couture, I use modern with ethnic influences to personalise my lines. All that is a way of mixing things, because the world today is a world of crossbreeding according to me. The dresses I make are for all women... Burlesque is the extravagance that I love, because I think in life you have to be daring. It all depends in the way it is done. When it is vogue, I adore it. The ridiculous can be funny, when we take life too seriously, it is no longer funny at all. The ridiculous has never killed anyone. It must also be said that the ridiculous can be sublime, I can't remember which author said the riduculous is often close to the sublime... I see Monte-Carlo as very romantic. Lots of movement and energy and enormously chic! There is always room to dream, the proof is that Monaco was in my dreams before I even had the opportunity to go there. The world of Princes and Princesses is in some way no longer a real one as it is a world apart. Yet in a way it is real because they exist and because they also have their own daily lives..."
